



# 86 Reggie BROWN

A big-play receiver who has shown the penchant for finding the end zone during his young career, Reggie Brown is a budding star in the NFL. The Eagles 2005 second round draft pick from Georgia, Brown, a tireless worker on and off the field, has averaged over 15 yards per catch and has posted 12 touchdowns over his first two NFL campaigns. During his rookie season, he set the team record for most receptions by a rookie wide receiver with 43. Brown inked a five-year contract extension in 2006 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2014.

### **BIRDSEED:**

- Claims to draw inspiration from his father, Gilbert, who used to train for football by running through the woods and dodging trees to simulate making cuts on the football field. Brown didn't pick up tree dodging as a part of his conditioning program, but he did pick up his father's work ethic. "I've always been obsessed with working out," said Brown. "I

always felt the extra work would do nothing but make me better." Incorporated swimming into his offseason workout regimen in 2007. Also used underwater boxing to help improve his handspeed which he feels will help him to get off the line on the field

- During his freshman year at Georgia, Brown's father, Gilbert, was diagnosed with having a brain tumor. Eventually, Gilbert had to undergo surgery to remove the tumor and was later forced to retire from his career in construction. "It was a rough time for my family," said Brown. "Sometimes he couldn't remember my name. My mother, Bobbie Jean, was always calm and composed through it all. I've never seen her break down. She was really strong. And the way he pulled through it is probably the reason that I am in the NFL right now. It made me work so much harder, so that we could all have a better life."

### **CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Set a record for most receptions (43) by an Eagles rookie receiver in 2005

### **2006 HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Led the Eagles in rec. yds. (816) and TDs (8), while posting 46 repts., all of which were career highs
- Ranked 6th in the NFL in yds. per catch (17.7) among receivers with at least 35 repts. Also finished tied for 10th in the NFL in rec. TDs (8) and tied for 16th in total TDs (9). Caught 15 passes of 20-yds. or more and 6 of 40-yds. or more
- In his first career playoff game vs. NYG (1/7/07, NFC-WC), tied a career high with 7 repts. for 73 yds. His 7 catches were the most by an Eagle in their playoff debut since Keith Byars (9) and Keith Jackson (7) did so in the "Fog Bowl" at Chicago in the NFC Divisional playoff game on 12/31/88
- Caught a crucial 19-yd. TD pass from Jeff Garcia for the go-ahead score to put the Eagles up 27-22 with 4:02 left to play in the 4th qtr. at NYG (12/17/06)
- Caught 6 passes for a career-high 121-yds., including a career-long 60-yd. TD grab from Donovan McNabb at NO (10/15/06). Also added a 15-yd. TD run for his first career rushing TD and, in doing so, became the first Eagles WR to have a rushing and receiving TD in the same game since James Thrash did so on 11/17/02 vs. Arz.
- Snagged a 40-yd. TD bomb in the 4th qtr. from Donovan McNabb for the go-ahead score to put the Eagles up 31-24 vs. Dal. (10/8/06)
- Recorded the first 100-yd. receiving day (5-106) of his career at SF (9/24/06)





**PERSONAL:**

- Has a daughter, Nevaeh (heaven backwards) Alexis (1/12/02). Purchased a five-bedroom home in Marlton, NJ, in 2007. Lives with his girlfriend Megaen. The two met while attending Georgia
- Posted 62 receipts. for 1,046 yds. and 10 TDs as a senior at Carrollton (GA) HS, earning All-America and *Atlanta Journal-Constitution* POY honors. Also earned All-America and Georgia POY honors as a junior in 1998, leading the team to the Class AA State Championship. During his four-year career, his high school compiled a 50-6 record
- Also lettered in basketball and track. Set the state's high school long jump record of 24'9"
- Set to host a radio show on ESPN Radio 920 during the 2007 season
- Undertook a 16-hour commute to visit Thailand for two weeks during the 2007 offseason. "I loved the culture over there. The people are so respectful and really religious. They have a day every week where they honor their king and wear yellow. They took such good care of us. Tourism is their main business these days."
- Earned his degree in child and family development. Was planning on becoming a guidance counselor or a coach, had football not worked out for him
